

While catching and rehabbing ridiculous numbers of street dogs, we learned a few things along the way about dogs, people, and tools.

Individuality | Each dog is a unique individual. Yes, breed influences personality traits as dogs were originally bred for jobs, but they are still influenced by both nature and nurture, or life experience. We have rehabbed many genetically fearful, abused, and neglected dogs. They do not respond to the normal training tools. They are afraid of humans and therefore, touch is not a reward, they cannot be motivated by human voice or praise as it frightens them, and they are not food motivated. These dogs need different tools to build trusting relationships with humans. Even with domesticated house pets, we see differences.

A Labrador and a Rat Terrier have different levels of ability to listen and engage, and herding dogs are often bred to make their own decisions while watching the flock. Each of the dogs learns differently and we have to make allowances in training styles and training tools for their individual learning abilities. This goes for the humans that own and love the dogs as well. Training comes down to communication and how well can we can communicate with the dogs and the owners. Communication needs bring us back to tools.

Tools | Any training tool, including affection, can be abused and can be used to produce negative results. If you are holding a hammer, then everything is a nail. If you don't have a hammer, but need a hammer, then suddenly, lots of things can function as a hammer. Remembering that you can hammer something without an actual hammer, we often use our base bucket of tools in creative ways to facilitate clear communication with the dogs. It's not about the tool; it's about clear communication and a positive, balanced result.

We approach dog training from a basis of industry best practices, a curated knowledgebase of experience, and by acknowledging that all dogs, and their owners, are individuals. We look to the dog's body language cues to provide feedback that informs our choice of tools. We're looking for the most gentle, positive tool for clear communication with the individual dogs. Clear communication and consistency creates the structure a balanced dog needs to be a successful, loving family pet.

Human Skills and Ability vs Wants and Will | Regardless of what we train the dog to do, the human owner has to be willing to follow any prescribed training program. Part of how we customize our training program is to understand the needs and the wants of the human owners. Without buy in from the owner on a plan, structure, consistency, and communication, the training will break down.

Just like dogs, not all people learn the same way. We adjust for learning abilities and the WILL to follow the training plan. In the end, dog training is about achieving the lifestyle the owner wants to live with their pet, and understanding what an owner, and their family, is willing to contribute to the process.





Some people are just born with the love of animals in their heart and they intuitively have "the magic touch". Fran is one such person. 



After the consultation, obedience training, pack waking, and or a combination package will be customized to get you and your four legged friend to your goals.



DAY TRIP PACKAGES

Application and assessment: All dogs must start with an application and a one (1) hour long consultation to check your dog's temperament and leash walking skills to see if they are suitable to go on multi-dog on-leash adventures. \$150

Single Adventure: One (1) fun day trip on an adventure to one of 6 local trails or state parks. We will send videos and pics from the location. For an additional fee, your pet will be dropped off at one of two local groomers for an after party bath;

pick up will be at the preferred groomer's location. Private outing - \$200. Shared adventure: \$150

Once a week | monthly package. Get a discount by purchasing a package of weekly adventures, a month at a time. Private Outing: \$700 | Shared Adventure: \$500. *Monthly packages must be used within a 45 day time period from purchase.





Could your rescue group benefit from learning more about doggie body language? Rescues and potential fosters benefit greatly from learning basic doggie body language and the special needs of dogs. We teach how to incorporate doggie body language in a foster's everyday interactions with the dogs.

Special needs fosters like feral, fearful, puppy mill, and hoarded dogs all have special needs and learn differently than your average house dog. How can you help or train a dog that won't take treats, doesn't like affection, and finds humans scary? We'll cover that.

How does your body language inform a fearful, unsocialized dog's mindset? What is a fearful dog telling you with its body language? What does play vs. aggression look like? We can help you solve all of those mysteries. Both the fosters and the dogs benefit from a human's ability to speak and interpret dog. Being informed can help prevent unnecessary bites and create a balanced dog.

Dog training is not inexpensive, but a well behaved dog is worth the time and effort for a lifetime of enjoyable, consistent behavior from your pet. A misbehaved dog can caused injuries, dog fights, and even death when the elderly or the young are involved. Dog bites against humans can cause the impoundment and quarantine of a dog, and a court could order a beloved family pet to be euthanized over a severe bite. Sadly, children are the most likely to be bitten by a family pet. All of these scenarios are tragic and preventable with solid training.

We believe that training the dog owners is as important as training the dogs. One of advantage in our collaborative partnership is training in the environment where the owner and dog lives. There is great value and convenience in a trainer coming to

your home and working with you in your environment. We solve the problems where they happen.

Board and train, with the follow up in home sessions, is also another highly convenient and effective way to put the training into real life scenarios in your life and your environment.

To put pricing in perspective, we've done a little research for you.

Local Comparison Pricing:

- Local dog sitters range between \$15-\$25 for 20 minutes of visit time with your pet (no training included)
- Local boarding facilities range from \$25 \$90 a day (no training included)
- Local doggie day care ranges from \$25-\$90 a day. (no training included)
- Local chain board and train basic training for one week \$900
- Local board and train private trainer for three weeks \$1,500-2,000
- Private lessons range between \$75-\$175/hr
- Initial pivate training consultations range between \$400-\$600

- ** For the health, safety and welfare of all, we require the following immunizations: Rabies, and Distemper / Parvo. An additional Bordetella vaccination is required for boarding and Day Trips.
- ** All boarding dogs must be on flea preventative and Day Trip dogs must be on flea and tick preventative. (we can make brand recommendations)
- ** Release forms must be signed and vaccination documentation provided before any sessions can begin.
- ** Equipment: Once we assess your dog, we will recommend equipment to help you communicate effectively and create structure for your dog. These items could be as simple as a \$3 clicker, a martingale collar, a can of mace (not for your dog), a kuranda bed for practicing "place", certain types of treats, or a kennel for containment when you are not home. Be prepared to spend a few bucks; we promise it won't be too painful and it will be well worth the investment. Most of

these tools are lifetime investments that will allow you the life and the relationship you always dreamed of with your 4 legged family members.

- ** You will have homework. Just because your dog will do it for the trainer, doesn't mean they will do it for you without a little practice and homework. It will be just a few minutes a day and it will be easy!
- ** Day Trips require drop off and pick up by the owner. Drop off location will be in the Winnetka Heights neighborhood of North Oak Cliff; pick up will be at one of the listed groomers in North Oak Cliff. Owner will pay the groomer for additional grooming services on pick up.
- ** Travel outside of a 10 mile radius require an additional trip charge per visit. Any trip charges will be included in the contract at the time the training plan is presented.
- ** Discounts programs or coupons are not valid during national holidays and local spring / fall breaks.
- ** Cancellation fees will be charged without 24 hour notice of appointment.
